Grammar Adventures



A **sentence** is a group of words that tell us something or ask something. It starts with a capital letter and ends with a full stop, question mark, or exclamation mark.

Kinds of Sentences

Statement Sentence: This kind of sentence gives information. It ends with a full stop.

Example: The cat is black.

Question Sentence: This kind of sentence asks something. It ends with a question mark.

Example: Are you coming to the park?

Command Sentence: This sentence tells someone to do something. It can end with a full stop or an exclamation mark.

Example: Close the door.

Exclamation Sentence: This sentence shows strong feeling and ends with an exclamation mark.

Example: Wow, that was amazing!






