



DIFFERENT KINDS OF PLANTS

Plants are of different shapes and sizes. Let us learn about them.





APPLE TREE COCONUT TREE

TALL AND BIG PLANTS

Tall and big plants are called trees. Trees like banyan and peepal are very big.

SMALL AND WEAK PLANTS

Small and weak plants are called herbs.






TULSI PLANT ROSE PLANT

SMALL BUT STRONG PLANTS

Small plants with strong stems are called shrubs.

WEAK AND THIN PLANTS


Some plants are weak and thin. They cannot stand on their own. They need some support to grow. These are called climbers. Some weak plants grow along the ground. These are called creepers.

Some plants have big leaves.





shapes and sizes.









Flowers are of different colours, shapes and sizes.

Some plants grow on land. They are called land plants.


■ Where do Plants Come From?

Have you seen any seed?




SEED GROW INTO A NEW PLANT




Animals Live in Different Places


WILD ANIMALS










How Do Animals Move?

ELEPHANT








Birds have two wings to fly. They use their legs to walk.

Some animals do not have legs. They crawl on their bellies.






SNAKE

Fish use their fins to swim in water.


Frogs and ducks use their webbed feet to swim.

Whales and turtles use their flippers to swim.




What do Animals Eat?
